Switch off to see the stars

A small town and neighbouring village in Wales have become the first 'dark sky communities," which means they switch off their street lights to reduce light pollution. Light pollution is the glow caused by manmade light from lamp posts and buildings. Presteigne and Norton in Powys switch off half of their street lights each night and dim the other half. Not only does this give residents a clearer view of the night sky, but it has also seen the return of local wildlife such as birds, bats and insects.

A 'wheely' good train ride

Transport for London is planning to install cardboard steering wheels at the front of its new DLR trains so children can pretend to drive them. The Mayor of London, Sadia Kahn, said that the driverless trains will feature a row of seats facing forwards and stickers that feature pretend buttons and switches. It is part of a new campaign to make the DLR experience more enjoyable. The DLR (Docklands Light Railway) is a driverless train line connected to the London Tube network.





They're not kid-ding!

Scientists say that goats are able to tell if you are happy or angry just by listening to your voice. Researchers from City University in Hong Kong, played human voices saying different phrases in either a happy or angry voice to 27 goats. They found that the goats reacted to the change in tone. The scientists think that goats may have developed this sensitivity because of their long history of teamwork with humans.


