This one-day event is overflowing with a wide variety of family fun activities, competitions and local food & drink – experience the best of farming and rural life from your county.





Robot guide dogs talk to humans


Engineers at the University of Glasgow have built robot guide dogs that can talk to humans to help them better explore their surroundings. The RoboGuide uses artificial intelligence, GPS navigation and sensors to map its environment and work out the best routes. Volunteers have been testing the RoboGuide at a local museum, where it showed them round and even talked about the exhibits on display!


